Summary of Results - December 1, 2020



80 Responses

50 Respondents indicated they were Township residents

The Winterfield Township Master Plan Citizen Survey was made available during the month of October 2020. Surveys were mailed to all Winterfield Township residents. Respondents had the option to complete the survey online, return by mail, or drop off at the Township Hall. With 443 total full-time residents (as of 2018), the 50 responses represent 11.3% of all residents.

Q1: What are Winterfield Township's most important features that make it a desirable place to live?






Q2: What are Winterfield Township's least favorable or appealing features? (cont.)



Open-ended responses when asked "Feel free to elaborate on your answer":

- We need more cell service and internet
- The roads are bad. Need to work on improving them and maintaining what is here. Grading more often would seem to be a great place to start; and plowing in the winter more often to make them more accessible.
- Preserve agricultural resources and enhance natural environment. Add parks and recreation. Promote diversity in community identity and character. Improve cellular and wireless internet access.

- Expand/Develop more ORV and Snowmobile trails throughout the township. Having world class access to ORV's and Snowmobiling activities will drive residential property sales, commercial (restaurants and shopping as long as access is available via trails/routes). Recent economic data shows that ORV sales are exploding and purchasers of these products are in a higher economic demographic. Furthermore the data shows that these enthusiasts have a propensity to invest and expend above average capital resources to further their interest in this activity. Winterfield township is uniquely positioned in an area where trail development can be accomplished with minimal capital investment. A will laid out and expansive trail system with easy access and proper mapping that is disseminated extensively will drive both transient business revenue as well as property investment. With its close proximity to adjacent and established DNR trails and Routes, a program of trail expansion is an economical, sound and cost-effective way to increase the townships quality of life, available activities, property values and economic prowess.





 EMS takes forever to find a location in Winterfield Township. 48 minutes from Lake George to Strawberry Road and Keehn Road. Thankfully, Marion Fire responded
 in 16 minutes.
- · There is no reason for washer, dryers, nonworking vehicles permanently left on properties to decay
- To make internet and cell service good at all locations
- Didn't move here to encourage more people to live here. Moved here b/c we like it how it is. Without better management/maintenance on the roads, you will never see more people here if that is your goal, better focus on them being able to travel in the area without difficulty and fear of actual damage to their vehicles.
- Clean up community. Provide infrastructure spanning township that keeps pace with changing technology. Care for public lands, improve public lands.
- Not at this time. Thank you for your time, energy, work and citizen survey.
- Should be NO commercial development of renewable energy. Especially wind turbines and solar farms. Please keep these out of Winterfield Township. The number one aim of our Master Plan should be the preservation of the existing rural/agricultural character of our township. We are very blessed with an abundance of wildlife and natural beauty, and should do everything to preserve and protect it.
- More community input listen at meetings. Don't just already make decisions before input. Re: tower off of Cook. Still crappy internet.
- Good internet at a reasonable price is needed for most people in our area. Our roads are being maintained well. Some gravel roads are very heavily traveled and need to be brined 3 times a year if possible. Unfortunately the farm equipment is very hard on the gravel roads.




Q8: In what age range do you fall?

Answered: 78 Skipped: 2 X-axis = answer choices




Q9: What is your gender?


Q10: How many people live in your household?


Q11: Are you a current Winterfield Township resident?


Q12: How long have you lived in Winterfield Township?
